

**GUIDELINES FOR PERMISSION TO EXIT MALAYSIA AND RETURN
FOR
EXPATRIATE / SKILLED WORKER / KNOWLEDGE WORKER /
RESIDENCE PASS – TALENT (RP-T) / PROFESSIONAL VISIT
PASS (PVP) / DEPENDANTS / LT-SVP / FOREIGN MAIDS**

IMPORTANT: Permission to Exit and Return to Malaysia will **ONLY** be considered for the purpose of official visit/ business/ meeting/ emergency cases or medical reasons.

1.	<p>Expatriate with an ACTIVE PASS which is currently in MALAYSIA, who desires to leave the country and to return to Malaysia</p> <p>a) Employment Pass Category (EP I, II & III)</p> <p>b) Residence Pass-Talent (RP-T)</p> <p>c) Professional Visit Pass (PVP)</p> <p>d) Dependants & Foreign Maids for (EP I, II, III & RP-T)</p> <p>e) Long Term Social Visit Pass (LT-SVP) for (EP I, II, III & RP-T)</p>	<p>i. The applicant is required to obtain Permission to Exit Malaysia and Return from Director General of Immigration Department Malaysia (DGIM).</p> <p>ii. The applicant has to submit for the Permission to Exit and Return to Malaysia via MYEntry in ESD online system to obtain the decision of the Director General of Immigration Department Malaysia (DGIM).</p> <p>iii. The client charter for approval by the DGIM is FOURTEEN (14) working days from the date of the application submission. All applications that did not receive any response from the Immigration Department of Malaysia after FOURTEEN (14) working days upon submission, will be considered as rejected.</p> <p>iv. Upon receiving the Permission to Exit and Return Letter from Expatriate Services Division (ESD), the applicant is to provide the Letter at the entry point upon departure and entering Malaysia.</p> <p>v. The applicant is allowed to exit Malaysia and MUST return within SIXTY (60) days from the issuance date of the letter.</p>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> vi. Prior to entering Malaysia, the applicant who wish to return to Malaysia is <u>ENCOURAGED</u> to undergo PCR Covid-19 Test abroad within THREE (3) days, and must be medically confirmed to be tested negative for Covid-19. vii. It is also COMPULSORY for the expatriate to DOWNLOAD AND INSTALL the “MySejahtera” mobile application before departure. The “MySejahtera” application enables the Ministry of Health (MOH) to monitor users’ health conditions, and for them to be able to take immediate actions in providing the treatments required. viii. Upon arrival in Malaysia, the applicant must present to the Immigration Officer at the entry point; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Entry Approval Letter; b. Valid Pass / Approval Letter / Visa with Reference (VDR); and c. PCR Covid-19 Test Abroad Result (if any) ix. It is COMPULSORY for the expatriate to DOWNLOAD AND INSTALL the “MySejahtera” mobile application. x. The applicant will be required to undergo another PCR Covid-19 Test by the Ministry of Health (MOH). The cost of PCR Covid-19 Test shall be borne by the applicant. xi. It is COMPULSORY to undergo a FOURTEEN (14) days QUARANTINE at a Quarantine Centre stipulated by the National Disaster Management Agency (NADMA) and Ministry of Health (MOH). The cost of quarantine

Failing to pay ALL COSTS or any MONIES DUE to the Government of Malaysia, applicant's active pass will be cancelled, blacklisted in Immigration system and issued with Notice of 'Not To Land' (NTL) for deportation.</p> <p>xiii. The applicant is required to comply with the rules and regulations set by the Immigration Department of Malaysia.</p> <p>xiv. Permitted Malaysia Entry Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA) b. Immigration Checkpoint, Sultan Iskandar Building (BSI), Johor (Entry by automobile) c. Sultan Abu Bakar Complex (2nd Link), Johor (Entry by automobile)
2.	<p>Expatriate (EP I, EP II & EP III) / RP-T / PVP / Dependants / LT-SVP / Foreign Maids who is currently in MALAYSIA, and wish to leave the country for good.</p> <p>e.g: Contract ending / Expiring in Malaysia / Pass has been shortened.</p>	<p>Exempted to obtain Permission to Exit Malaysia from Director General of Immigration Department Malaysia (DGIM).</p>
